

	<b>Directions for Scorecard</b>
<b>Yards</b>	Yardage for the hole; I may note if it's uphill (UH) or downhill (DN).
<b>Wind</b>	Direction & strength; SWW (strong with the wind); LAW (light against the wind); R-L (wind blowing right to left); etc. This helps give a more accurate record of driving distance since I'll hit a longer drive with the wind, shorter against it.
<b>Tee Shot</b>	Club used; abbreviated with one letter or number & letter combination; Driver=D, 3-wood=3W, 7 iron=7
<b>Act. Yds</b>	Distance tee shot traveled
<b>F/LR/RR</b>	F=Fairway, LR=Left Rough, RR=Right Rough.
<b>2nd shot</b>	Club & Distance from center of green. Example, 7-150, If pin is upfront or back I'll add a note; 6-150 PB...I'm using a 6 iron from 150 since the pin is in the back.
<b>Note</b>	Describe shot: short, long, #yards, left, right, sandtrap; hill; knockdown, etc.
<b>3rd</b>	Same as above
<b>Note</b>	Same as above
<b>4th</b>	Same as above
<b>Note</b>	Same as above
<b>1st putt Ft</b>	Distance of first putt to hole
<b>short/long</b>	Note short, long
<b>right/left</b>	Note right or left, high or low side of hole. Ex..Right/Lo or Left/Hi.
<b>2nd putt</b>	Same as above
<b>right/left</b>	Same as above
<b>3rd putt</b>	Same as above
<b>Total</b>	Score for hole; also note in corner; F if hit Fairway, G if hit Green, and number of putts. This makes it easy to add up F & G hit in regulation and number of putts.
<b>+/-</b>	Over or under on each hole, makes it easy to check total score.
